



Checklist General Precautionary Measures

- All healthcare operators and healthcare professionals in Dubai Healthcare City are required to comply with the precautionary measures against spread of COVID-19 issued by DHCA and other concerned authorities. Failure to comply will result in violations /penalties.
- 2. Healthcare operators shall perform daily internal audits to monitor compliance using the general precautionary measures checklist (Appendix 1). The daily check should be recorded digitally and maintained for inspection purposes.

Effective date: 10 May, 2020 until further notice.

1.	Healthcare operators operate at 30% capacity (staff and				
	visitors) to maintain public safety at all times.				
2.	Working hours for outpatient services end at 9:00pm in				
	compliance with the hours of the national sterilisation program,				
	which begin at 10:00pm every day.				
3.	Ensure safe distance - no less than two metres between patients				
	in the waiting areas and employees at the workplace.				
4.	Healthcare professionals practice physical distancing among				
	themselves and patients unless wearing PPE.				
5.	Patients' screening carried out by asking appropriate questions				
	regarding symptoms and history of the illness prior to visiting				
	the facility.				
6.	Conduct mandatory temperature checks for everyone entering				
	the facility including staff, patients and visitors.				





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7.	Healthcare operators ensure minimum 20 minutes between		
	appointments in a manner that guarantees sufficient time to		
	sterilise all surfaces inside the examination room before the next		
	patient arrives.		
8.	Staff, patients and visitors in the healthcare facility are aware of		
	the precautionary measure (i.e. hand hygiene, cough etiquette,		
	use of PPE).		
9.	Provision of face masks, hand disinfectants and sanitiser at the		
	entrance of the facility - accessible to all.		
10.	All individuals in the healthcare facility wear face masks.		
11.	Healthcare operators provide sterilisation materials for surfaces		
	and rooms.		
12.	In case of suspected contact with a COVID-19 case, carry tracing		
	procedures to check the date of travel and medical history.		
	Follow relevant reporting procedures.		
13.	A dedicated area to isolate potential positive cases available in		
	the healthcare operator		
14.	Suspected/confirmed COVID-19 is reported to the authority as		
	per the Incident Protocol.		
15.	Healthcare operator has clear protocol to manage any cases with		
	positive COVID-19.		
16.	Hand hygiene materials available and sufficient for staff and		
	patients.		
17.	Healthcare operator provides awareness among facility staff		
	about compliance with rules and regulations relating to infection		
	control set by DHCA and related health authorities.		
18.	Healthcare operators have a signed contract with an		
	environmental cleaning and disinfection company approved by		
	Dubai Municipality (DM) for sterilisation and disinfection		
	services.		
19.	Healthcare operators perform cleaning and disinfection as per		
	DHCA guidelines.
